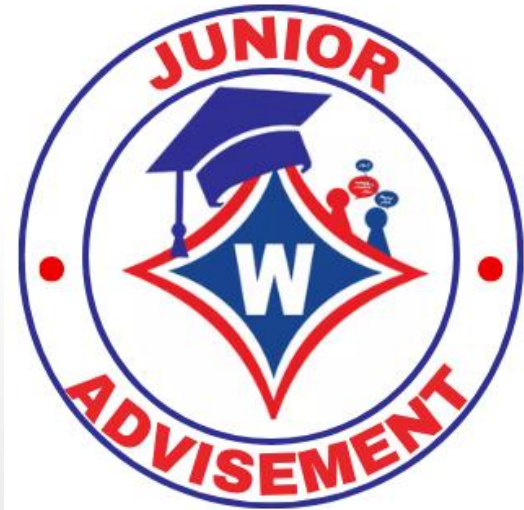

WHAT IS JUNIOR ADVISEMENT?

Junior Advisement aims to help you plan for senior year and ensure you have all your Georgia high school graduation requirements.

There are four parts:

1. **PowerPoint Presentation** – to provide you with further information about post-secondary options after graduating high school
2. **Bridge Bill Survey** – the state of Georgia requires all juniors to complete this survey in Naviance
3. **Individual Graduation Plan (IGP)** – allows students to view and plan out courses for senior year to meet academic and career goals
4. **Check out with a school counselor** – once you've completed the Bridge Bill and IGP, you will check out with any available school counselor in the media center's main area

APPRENTICESHIPS & TRADES

- Training lasts 1 – 5 years and provides on-the-job training, often paid.
- These kinds of programs can lead to secure and well-paying jobs.
- Additional education and training can provide high levels of advancement and increased salaries.
- Examples include electricians, plumbers, HVAC technicians, certified cooks, firefighters, automotive/aviation technicians, licensed practical nurses, welders, and legal assistants.



STATE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE

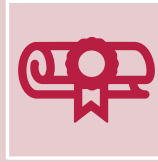

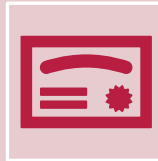

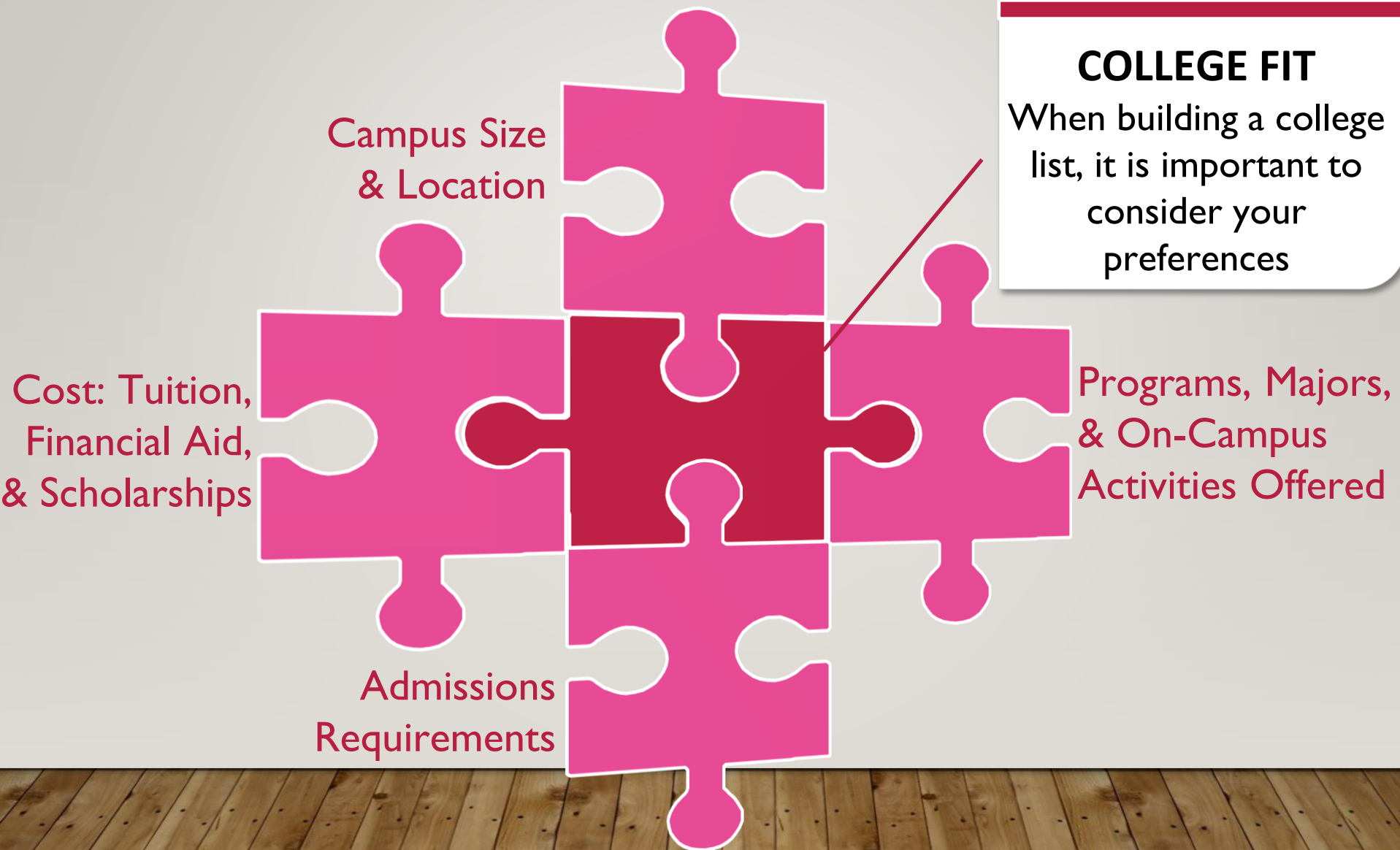

REQUIREMENTS – THEY AREN'T THE SAME

High School Graduation

- Determined by GA Department of Education (GaDOE)
- Tracked by you, your teachers, and your school counselor
- You graduate if you earn the minimum 23 required credits in specific areas

College Admissions

- Determined by the individual college
- Tracked by you – it is your responsibility to find out what the school wants
- Are needed before you can be accepted – you may not be accepted with just the minimum
- May include college entrance exams (SAT, ACT, or Accuplacer)

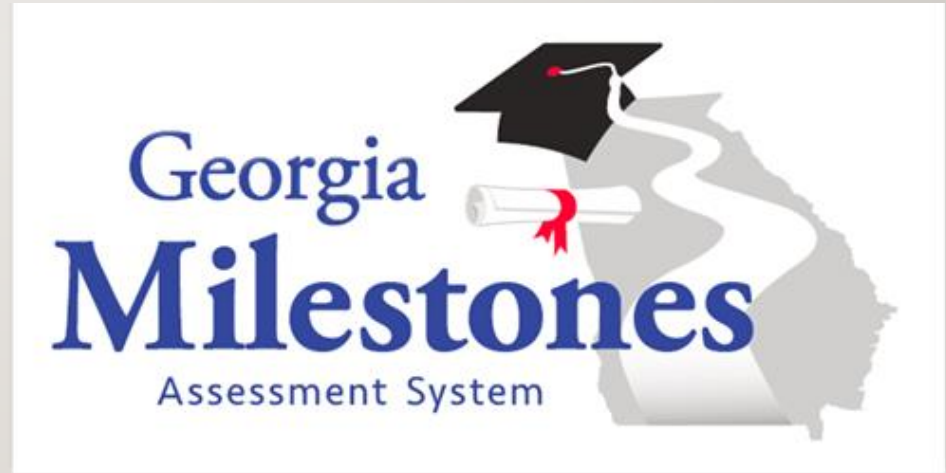

EOC TESTING

AM. LIT & US HISTORY

- The Georgia End-of-Courses (EOC) are statewide tests that assess student knowledge and skills in the four core subjects:
 - Am Lit*
 - Algebra I
 - Biology
 - US History*
- EOCs will be given in late April to early May
- EOC scores factor 20% of final grades
- Test Prep & Resources
 - Study guides
 - Practice tests
 - Peer tutoring
 - Extra help sessions with teachers
 - Study skills



** Most Juniors will take the EOC in Am Lit and US History in late Spring*

COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS – SAT & ACT

- Some colleges have adopted a **test-optional** policy. It is your responsibility to research each college's requirements.
- Most colleges will accept either SAT or ACT
- We recommend that students take both the SAT & ACT at least once by the end of their junior year
- Students receiving free/reduced lunch qualify for fee waivers (email **rebecca.english@cobbk12.org**)

- Virtual (starting Spring 2024)
- 2 sections (Math and Reading)
- No penalty for guessing
- 1600 maximum score

- 4 sections (Math, ELA, Science & Reading)
- No penalty for guessing
- 36 maximum score

HOPE SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

- **HOPE Scholarship (4-year public college in Georgia)**
 - 3.0 GPA for core academic courses
 - English, Math, Science, Social Studies, & World Language
 - 4 HOPE rigor courses
- **Zell Miller Scholarship (4-year public college in Georgia)**
 - 3.7 GPA for core academic courses
 - 1200 on SAT (I sitting) or 26 on ACT (I sitting)
 - 4 HOPE rigor courses
- **HOPE Grant (2-year technical college in Georgia)**
 - For students seeking specific technical certificates or diplomas
 - No GPA requirement
 - No testing requirement
 - No rigor course requirement

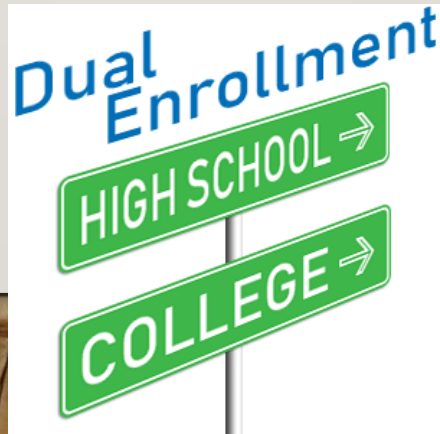
- HOPE GPA is calculated by the Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC) and found on the [GAfutures website](#) (it is not listed on the Walton transcript)

- **Updates**

- Recent changes were made to the HOPE Scholarship program
- Students that qualified for any of the HOPE Scholarship or Grant programs for the 2023-24 school year received 100% tuition (e.g., Class of 2023)
- The GSFC approves the fiscal budget every spring, so there is no guarantee that this will happen in future years.
- High school students should still aim for the more academically rigorous Zell Miller Scholarship, according to the GSFC president

DUAL ENROLLMENT

- Georgia's Dual Enrollment (DE) program allows high school students to earn college credit while working on their high school diploma.
- DE covers tuition, mandatory fees, and required textbooks.
- The goal of DE is to increase college access and completion and prepare students to enter the workforce with the skills they need to succeed.
- Students can take both academic and CTAE (career tech) courses.



☐ **Undecided**

Not sure what to do after high school? Talk to a school counselor about what's best.

☐ **Gap or Service Year**

Take a gap or service year between high school and the start of my post-work, educational activities, or travel to give back to a community or to help

☐ **College: Associate's Degree**

Earn an associate's degree or certificate in two years or less by attending a two-year community college or junior college.

☐ **College: Bachelor's Degree**

Earn a Bachelor's degree in four years by attending a four-year private or public college or university.

☐ **Career Education or Trade School**

Enroll in a short-term training program at a career or vocational-technical college and earn a certificate or associate's degree for an industry such as health care, cosmetology, and plumbing.

☐ **Apprenticeship Program**

Enroll in an apprenticeship to get on-the-job training with classroom instruction and mentorship that leads to a skilled trade or profession.

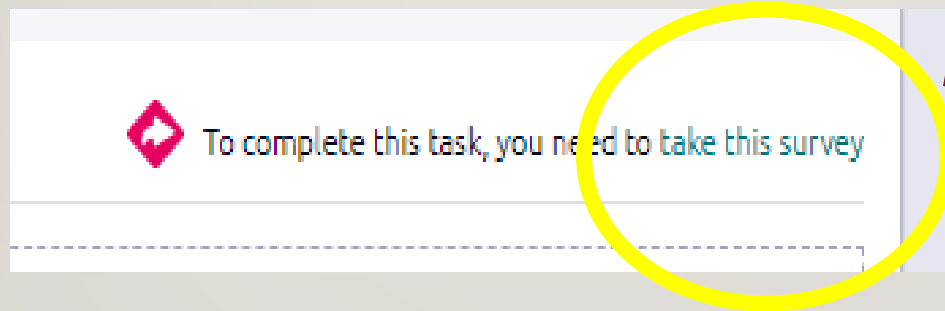



 - This is a plan, not registration, for the remainder of 11th and 12th grade!


