if you can handle taking an
Honors or AP course, most
colleges prefer you earn a B
in these courses than an A in
on-level courses.

MAKE YOURSELF KNOWN
Let the colleges know why they
should choose you and why you are
specfiically interested in them.

SHOW DEMONSTRATED INTEREST
Visit and tour campuses in-person,
attend college fairs, and talk to and
correspond with the admissions
officers to let them know you are
interested in their schools.

DISCOVER WHICH COLLEGE

Ask yourself where you will enjoy
spending the next four years of
your life.

D LEAN ON ADMISSIONS OFFICERS
Admissions officers encourage you as
the student (not your parents) to ask
questions and contact them directly.
They are happy to help.
